Greater Miami USBC Association Annual Meeting Minutes July 16, 2022

President Patty Nevers called meeting to order at 11:30am. The President's report was given.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Dianna Rose and Kristin Smith gave the invocation.

Patty welcomed all the attendees and guests to the meeting.

The Association Board Members, officers and Florida State Directors were introduced by Patty.

There were 21 attendees at the meeting which satisfied our required quorum of 15 attendees.

Glenda Beckett briefly presented the minutes from the last year and the Actions of the Board from last year. This report is included in the booklet that is provided for the attendees.

The Committee Reports are all included in the booklet and each committee chairman gave a brief report.

Budget Committee – The delegates were shown the approved budget for the upcoming year.

Community Service – Pam - reported that \$13,000.00 was given to Florida Breast Cancer Research and \$2500.00 was given to BVL. This money is made up of donations from bowlers as well as from entry fees for tournaments.

Ways and Means – Miguel – We have had a table at every tournament that we have. Money collected from ways & means is shared between our youth scholarship program and our general fund for the association, with the exception of our BFC, BVL and Youth Tournaments. We have 50/50 raffles at most of our tournaments. Our baked goods are always a hit – especially "Blanche's Brownies!"

This year the Board decided to have a drawing and give a paid sanction to a bowler, not on our Board, for the upcoming year. This year's winner was Cindy Rudbeck.

#### Legislative Session

For policies & procedures this year, there was an amendment brought up to increase the local dues for the Association. This amendment passed the local board and needs to be presented to the entire membership present at the meeting for approval.

Miguel motioned that the local dues be increased to \$10, bringing total sanction fees for adults to \$25.00; Ronnye seconded it. The motion was passed with an affirmative vote by the membership present. Sanction fees going forward will be \$25.00 for adults and \$20.00 for those who are participating in a senior league.

Elections of Board Members and Officers –There is 1 officer position and 3 Director Positions up for election this year; Incumbent President Patty Nevers and Jennifer Hough names were put on the ballot. Patty was reelected as President. Directors up for reelection are; Miguel Baro, Glenda

Beckett, Jennifer Hough. The 3 Directors positions were reelected by acclimation since there were no additional candidates.

Florida State Annual Convention is October 7-9, 2022 in St. Pete, FL. and we are allowed 4 delegates. Delegate positions were elected; Sabrina Binegar, Sharon Colon, Patty Nevers, Pam Cameron. Alternates elected were; Miguel, Jennifer, Dianna & Shelley. Sabrina opted not to go because of a date conflict so Miguel was moved to the Delegate list.

USBC Annual Convention is in Las Vegas April 24-27, 2023 and we have 3 delegates. National Delegates elected are; Miguel Baro, Sabrina Binegar and Jennifer Hough.

There being no further business the meeting was dismissed at 12:55pm.

Patty thanked everyone for attending. After adjournment the board members need to be sworn in.

### COMMUNITY SERVICE

In addition to all GMUSBC's accomplishments, the Community Service Committee focuses on two major charities for our local community. We raise funds for our military veterans, BVL, which is donated to the local VA Administration, and for breast cancer research, education and helping those in need. Our funds raised for breast cancer are donated to Florida Breast Cancer Foundation.

As we entered the year with the diminishing threat of COVID, we were faced with the lower number of sanctioned bowlers. However, we planned, prevailed, and carried on with our fundraisers. Our first endeavor was the collection of funds through league donations for both BVL and RTC. Thanks to all bowlers who opened their wallets and donated.

We held our "Rolling Toward a Cure" tournament on October 23, 2022. We had a tremendous turnout and participation with over 100 entries, adult and youth. It was a fantastic day with all the bowlers dressed in their pink shirts. We had basket raffles, 50/50 drawings, ways and means table, baked goods, and we even had the Metro Dade pink-mobile parked out in front; it was a "something for everyone" kind of day. We all worked for the same goal, to raise funds for breast cancer research. Florida Breast Cancer Foundation supplied all bowlers with bright pink accessory bags, a delight to all. Our winners were Manuel Lacayo, Christine Clark and Alejandro Mejia-Blanco for the youth. In addition to our tournament, we were able to hold a Rolling Toward a Cure Mail-ogram (in-league play) tournament. This took place during the week of February 13-18, 2023, with 138 league participants. First place winners were Siku Martinez, Ryan Toffoli, and Christian Farfan, our youth winner.

We held two fundraising events for BVL. Our mail-o-gram for this cause took place on November 7-12, 2022, with 134 entries and winners being Christine Pascual-Fernandez, Steve Ho-Sang, and Justin Jesurum-Miranda, our youth winner. Our BVL Bakers Doubles tournament was on April 23, 2023, with 39 teams competing. Emelie and Emerio, Jr, daughter and dad, came out on top as our winners.

We are very proud to say, to date, we have raised a total of \$8,389.36 to donate to Florida Breast Cancer Foundation. At the end of July, we will present our check in the amount of \$2,260.25 to the local Miami Veterans Hospital.

As you can see, your donations, tournament entries and participation go a long way. We encourage all bowlers to check with their league secretaries for entries, review our website and look for Facebook postings. We now have a bulletin board where we post our events for all to see. Our goal is to inform all and grow these events with more participants and donations. A huge thanks to ALL.

# Committee Report for Annual Meeting July 15th, 2023 Tournament Committee

During the 2022-23 Association year the committee held 7 regular tournaments and two special tournaments; an Adult/Youth Tournament, Women's, Open and Youth City Tournaments, Senior Tournament, Rolling Towards the Cure Tournament and the Top 8 Invitational Tournaments. This year we held the Top 8 in 2 parts, Youth one weekend and the adults later. Our special tournaments were a BVL Bakers Doubles Tournament and a 9 Pin No Tap tournament.

July 24, 2022 the Annual Top 8 Invitational Tournament was held. There were 8 men & 8 women who qualified. This is a tournament to recognize the Top 8 highest averages in the Association. The only requirement is for each bowler to have bowled at least 60 games in the past season in 2 leagues. This year we have a new division – it's called the Super Seniors Top 6. This division is for our bowlers aged 64 & up.

On October 23, 2022 the Annual Rolling Towards A Cure Tournament was held in support of Breast Cancer Research. There was a total of 104 entries, including Women's division, Open division, Youth Division & a scratch division. There was a total donation from the proceeds of the tournament of \$8300.00 this includes entry donations as well as donations from individuals and other fund-raising events for this cause.

On December 11, 2022 the Association held its annual Don & Paula Carter Adult/Youth Doubles Tournament. This year we were fortunate to be able to offer a Junior Gold Spot. There was \$1000.00 added to the prize fund. There was a total of 29 entries in two divisions.

On January 22st & 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023 the Annual Women's City Tournament was held. We had a doubles division with an optional singles event as well as optional scratch. \$850.00 was added to the prize fund.

The breakdown of entries and payouts is as follows:

Women's Doubles had 23 entries with \$1064.50 in prize money Doubles Scratch had 7 entries with \$70 in prize money Women's Singles had 34 entries with \$875.50 in prize money Scratch Singles had 8 entries with \$40.00 in prize money All Events had 32entries with \$330.00 paid out in prize money

On February 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup>, 2023, the GMUSBC Association held the Annual Youth City Tournament. This year \$2000.00 was added to the prize fund. This year the tournament was changed to a Doubles/Singles Event.

The breakdown of entries and Scholarship payouts for the Youth City Tournament is as follows:

Youth Doubles had 17 entries with \$993.00 paid out in scholarship money

Youth Singles had 28 entries with \$936.00 paid out in scholarship money All Events had 18 entries with \$760.00 paid out in scholarship money

Feb. 25, 26, March 3 & 4, 2023 were the dates for the Open Adult City Tournament. There was a total of \$1,900.00 added to the prize fund courtesy of GMUSBC.

The breakdown of Entries and Payouts for the Open Adult City Tournament is as follows:

Open Team had 25 entries with \$2,775.00 in prize money
Open Doubles had 60 entries with \$2,750.00 in prize money
Open Singles Division had 117 entries with \$2,443.75 in prize money
Open All-Events had 78 entries with \$640.00 in prize money
Scratch Events had a total of 143 entries with a total of \$1030.00 in prize money paid out.

The Senior 50+ Tournament this year held on April 2, 2023 had 50 entries with a combined prize fund paid out of \$1,144.00, including scratch.

On April 23, 2023, the Association held a BVL Doubles Tournament. There were 39 entries in the tournament. The prize fund paid out was \$852.00, There was a total donation to BVL of \$2400.00 from the proceeds of the tournament as well as donations from individuals and other fund-raising events for this cause.

On May 21, 2023 the Association held a 9 Pin No Tap Tournament. There was a total of 49 entries. There were 39 adult entries, and the prize fund paid out was \$585.00. There were 10 youth entries who had a prize fund of \$150.00 deposited in their SMART account.

The Annual Invitational Top 8 Tournament Youth Division was held on June 10, 2023. The decision was made last year to separate the Youth & Adults so that the Youth who are going to Junior Gold could participate in our Local Top 8.
